



Carbon Monoxide Safety

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Carbon monoxide is colorless and odorless. Working alarms are essential.

FIRE SAFETY TIPS

- 1 Install carbon monoxide alarms according to the manufacturer's instructions, especially near sleeping areas and on levels of the home with fuel-burning equipment.
- 2 Test carbon monoxide alarms regularly and replace batteries and alarms as directed by the manufacturer.
- 3 Have fuel-burning appliances, fireplaces, chimneys, and heating systems inspected and maintained.
- 4 Never run a vehicle, generator, grill, or other fuel-burning engine inside a garage, home, basement, or other enclosed space.
- 5 If a carbon monoxide alarm sounds, move everyone to fresh air and call 911 from outside.

REMEMBER

Do not re-enter until emergency personnel say the area is safe.
